- New approaches that include protected areas development and management, community-based conservation and education initiatives, population genetics, wildlife medicine, fundraising, and action planning, as well as environmental education, marketing, and public relation messages for tapir conservation are addressed and discussed.
- 6th symposium 2014 Brazil: 90 participants from 25 countries
- 80% of the symposium budget comes from donations from American, European and Latin American zoos
- 7<sup>th</sup> Symposium: Houston Zoo November 13-18, 2017
