

State and Future of Recently Downgraded SSPs



- Why now? Program leader vacancies. TAG will be faced with many many more programs ineligible as SSPs in the
 near future due to new standards. TAG wanted to start working this model with a few to see what challenges it
 presents.
- Common Waterbuck: Least concern species. Common in private hands in U.S and in South African game ranches.
- Slender-horned gazelle: Endangered. North America represents an important assurance population for this
 species. Potential for reintroduction programs in North Africa with North American population supplying animals.
- Monitored or Consortium? Maybe both. What does this mean?
 - Monitored is AZA term for non-SSP that TAG is still keeping track of. Many of these will have studbooks.
 - Consortium? No set model. Will likely be different from one species to the next and is largely dependent
 on institutional interest and support. Programs may be monitored with no consortium or monitored
 consortiums.
- TAG has reached out to all AZA holders to determine their interest in continuing to manage these species, continuing to manage the studbook for the purposes of managing continued breeding and transfer recommendations, and financial support for a population biologists time and support. More to come.
- Some challenges aside from determining financial support for pop bio support have occurred. Documents
 disappeared from AZA website at first and now are on TAG site but difficult to find. TAG has decided to hold off on
 downgrading any more programs until APM mandated timing.
- Lots of questions from institutions, most commonly, what will this cost? Concerns for this cost that will add up for all of the species that get downgraded from SSP but still would like to be managed using population biologist support.
- TAG remains committed to all of our priority species, whether they are SSPs or not.
