





Figure 2. Age distribution of A) the entire population, N= 202 (60.142.0) and B) the analytical population N=92 (13.79.0) in the Plains Zebra SSP.








Recommendation Outcomes for Equid TAG Current Fulfillment Rates for BREED WITH Recs Across SSPs








Przewalski's Horse Clone Update

Drought in Kenya – Grevy's Zebra Trust

Extended severe drought in northern Kenya

5 rainy seasons missed (currently in the 6th – waiting to see what will happen). Basically drought ongoing since October 2020

Emergency feeding/watering initiated by Grevy's Zebra Trust

GZT teams fed an average of 500 Grevy's zebra daily. Of these, 45% were lactating females and foals, 23% non-lactating females, 8% pregnant females, 20% bachelor males and 4% territorial males.

GZT distributed 24,000 bales of hay, 600 bales of lucerne (alfalfa grass), 1,200 kgs of lucerne pellets, and 1,930 kgs of nutritional supplements.

GZT teams drove a total of 34,000 kms to deliver feed to Grevy's zebra herds.

As a result of feeding program, majority of zebras were able to maintain a body condition score of 3 to 3.5 (1 = poor, 5 = excellent).

Approximately 10% of the Grevy's zebra target population died of droughtrelated causes, which is low compared to other wildlife species in Kenya where no supplementary feeding intervention was implemented.





Great Grevy's Rally

Census of Grevy's zebra conducted every other year

Last Rally January 2020. Did not occur in 2022 due to extended drought situation in northern Kenya.

Tentatively scheduled to happen next in January 2024.

Historically, a team of zoo professionals has assisted with the Great Grevy's Rally.
